The Student Achievement Day event will feature a government and industry panel discussion on careers in the composites field, student presentations, a poster session and competition, and student awards.

A highlight of the day will be a lunchtime presentation by Betty Wolf, business planning process leader at Owens Corning, on the company's **Composite App Challenge**. The purpose of this global competition is to find the next big applications for composite materials in the areas of infrastructure durability, fuel efficiency, renewable energy, and protection from harm. Three \$10,000 awards have been reserved for university students.




"This will be a unique event because it will not only celebrate the achievements of center-affiliated students through the awards ceremony but also provide a venue for our students to present their work to an audience of their peers and a chance for anyone interested in composites to learn about current job opportunities in the field," says Suresh Advani, George W. Laird Professor of Mechanical Engineering and associate director of the center.

The panel will feature representatives from a number of companies as well as several government agencies, including Owens Corning Science & Technology, the Boeing Company, Dassault Aviation, M Cubed Technology, the Army Research Laboratory, and the Naval Surface Warfare Center.
